The **STOPP/START Criteria for Potentially Inappropriate Prescribing in Older People Version 2** have been expanded and updated for the purpose of minimizing inappropriate prescribing in older adults. These criteria are based on an up-to-date literature review and consensus validation among a panel of experts.
