David Nolan is the Chief Performance Officer for Alameda Alliance for Health, responsible for assessing, monitoring and improving the overall performance of the Alliance in all phases of its work. He ensures that financial, operational and quality goals are aligned with the mission, vision and values of the Alliance. Prior to joining the Alliance, Mr. Nolan was the principal and founder of Chi Partners, a health care consulting firm focused on public policy as it relates to long-term care. Additionally, he completed a strategic plan for long-term care integration for the City and County of San Francisco in preparation for their entry into the Duals in 2015; assisted Colorado's Department of Health Care Policy and Financing with strategic planning and led a team of health care consultants to create the Assisted Living Waiver Pilot Program for the CA Department of Health Care Services.
